Can you tell what information does a EU national need to provide before they are issued with a NI number eg

What fines are issued to EU nationals who fail to register before they start work or claim any benefits within the UK after a period of time.

DWP response

1) Can you tell me what information does an EU national need to provide before they are issued with a National Insurance number?

Anyone making an application for a National Insurance number must be able to prove:

- Their identity, and;
- That they have a legal right to work in the UK for employment related applications.

EU nationals are required to produce their passport and / or national identity card to prove their identity and right to work.

2) Do they need to complete a registration form <u>https://www.gov.uk/eea-</u> registration-certificate

EU nationals do not need to apply for a registration certificate.

3) How long do they need to live in the UK before they can be issued with a NI number?

There is no specified time that EU nationals need to live in the UK before they can be issued with a National Insurance number, however before a National Insurance Number can be issued the individual must be able to satisfy the legislative criteria for obtaining a National Insurance number. They must be either:

• working, about to start work or actively seeking employment, or

- entitled to claim benefit, or
- be entitled to and wish to pay voluntary Class 3 National Insurance Contributions

• be referred by student loan company.

4) What information does the UK ask of EU nationals before they provide them with a NI number?

EU nationals are asked to provide a range of information including:

- Personal details name, date of birth, gender, details of marriage / civil partnership as well as information relating to a spouse / partner, or exspouse / ex-partner.
- Address in the UK (and a correspondence address if different), different UK addresses in the last two years including details of current and previous stays in the UK (of more than 30 days).
- UK landline and mobile telephone numbers.
- Where they were born; town, county and country, last address in the last EU country they were last resident.
- Nationality.
- Social security reference number in their country of nationality.
- Employment details / details of self-employment.

5. What fines are issued to EU nationals who fail to register before they start work or claim any benefits within the UK after a period of time?

No fines are issued to EU nationals who fail to apply for a National Insurance number before they start work; however, there are various rules and regulations in place to ensure HMRC still receives the correct amount in tax. An individual can start work without a National Insurance number, however must apply for a number upon starting work.

If an individual makes a claim to benefit without a National Insurance number and is found to be entitled to benefit, a National Insurance number application will be made for them as part of the benefit process.
