<p>August 4th until August 19th</p>	<p>Students will create/or log into collegeboard.org accounts. Students are only allowed ONE account. Students <u>will have to contact College Board</u> if they need help merging accounts. Students will join your AP class via your “Class Join Code.”</p>
<p>August 22nd</p>	<p>Students will sign into College Board classroom support system and complete a simple activation process.</p>
<p>August 3rd until October 28th</p>	<p>FRL - Fee Waiver Eligibility Letter due to Mrs. Carswell at ajcarswell@mpsaz.org</p> <p>To receive a fee reduction, students must be approved for free or reduced lunch for the current school year. If you have lost the eligibility letter, you can request one at http://www.mpsaz.org/food/meal-applications/ and click on Request an Eligibility Letter on the right side.</p>

- Check-in will begin at 7:30am for morning exams, morning exams will begin promptly at 8:00am (note: this is earlier than Skylines 8:15 start time)
- Afternoon exams, check-ins will begin at 11:45 am
- Your attendance will be excused during the exam.
- Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri- if applicable, morning testers will be excused to take 5th hour lunch after testing, afternoon testers will be excused to take 4th hour lunch.
- There are NO MAKE-UPS if you are late and/or miss the exam.
- Students must pay full exam fees or submit their FRL Letter by Friday, October 28th at 3:30pm

What Students Can and Cannot Bring to the AP EXAMS

What Students Can Bring

- **Several sharpened No. 2 pencils** with erasers, for all responses on the multiple-choice answer sheet.
- **Pens with black or dark blue ink** for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- **A watch** that does not have internet access, does not beep, and does not have an alarm.
- **Approved calculator** with the necessary capabilities for the AP[®] Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics exams. Visit College Board [Calculator Policy](#) page to find the calculator policy for each subject and a list of approved graphing calculators.
- **A ruler or straightedge** for taking the AP Physics exam. Protractors are not allowed.
- **A school-issued photo ID or current government-issued photo ID.**

What Students Cannot Bring

- Electronic equipment (phones, smartwatches, or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices, portable listening or recording devices—MP3 player, iPod, etc.—cameras or photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices).
- Books, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils
- Scratch paper
- Watches that beep or have an alarm, or smartwatches
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions
- Food or drink is not allowed in the testing room but can be accessed during breaks.
- Clothing with subject-related information and ear plugs
