Filling the Behavioral Health Care Gap

Integrating behavioral health with primary care fosters a better patient experience

In her 20 years of practicing medicine, EvergreenHealth primary care physician Amy Hoing, MD, says that connecting patients with behavioral health care has often presented years-long challenges. Similarly, as a primary care doctor, Donya Hosseinian, MD, has filled the gaps with her patients, researching medications and treatments to address behavioral needs when patients face barriers to accessing specialty care.

But this system is changing at EvergreenHealth, starting with the primary care clinic at Canyon Park where Dr. Hoing and Dr. Hosseinian practice. In 2023, EvergreenHealth began integrating behavioral health professionals into the practice. The clinic now has four therapists and a psychiatrist available to existing Canyon Park patients age 13 and older.

This model allows patients to schedule talk therapy appointments in a familiar setting, taking into consideration other primary care needs. The goal is to provide immediate, short-term service that aims to help people connect with longer-term support if they need it.

“It’s incredible to have this dedicated therapy team here to consult with,” said Dr. Hosseinian. “Patients have the benefit of their primary care and mental health providers collaborating on their care – neither provider has to start from scratch.”

Dr. Hoing says the new model has been a game-changer for many of her patients: “It’s so great to say ‘I have a therapist who can help you, she’s right down the hall’ or ‘our psychiatrist can see you today’ to a patient in crisis. That personal connection has made a huge difference.”

Kris Stone, Director of Care Management, said the program has been successful not just in patient care and access, but also in attracting talented new primary care providers to EvergreenHealth: “Having this integrated model is a major plus for primary care doctors, who are often left with limited resources to help their patients with behavioral health needs.”

How your gift helps

Donor support helped EvergreenHealth develop this patient-centered model that has proved so successful in Canyon Park. Now we have the goal of expanding to more primary care locations. The largest barrier to this is the high startup costs of standing up the practice and hiring behavioral health specialists. Philanthropic contributions will directly help expand these services on the Eastside.

With cold and flu season upon us, the Weidner Vaccination Clinic at EvergreenHealth is busier than ever. Since opening in June 2024, the clinic has offered essential vaccines for EvergreenHealth patients, staff, and anyone in the community who needs them, operating as part of the existing pharmacy at the Kirkland hospital.

“The clinic is so helpful for high-risk patients who need vaccines right away as they’re being discharged,” said Elisa Vila, RPh., CACP, Executive Director and System Leader of Pharmacy Services. “It helps ensure EvergreenHealth staff can conveniently get needed vaccines, as well, which benefits our patients too.”

The clinic was made possible by a generous donation from Ana and Dean Weidner, who worked closely with EvergreenHealth’s Infectious Disease Medical Director Francis X. Riedo, MD, on supporting infection control and hand hygiene practices since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.

“Infection control and good vaccination practices are more important than ever before,” said Dr. Riedo. “Lack of access is a major barrier to vaccination, so expanding access with a convenient place to get vaccinated in the hospital is a simple yet vital step toward a healthier community.”

The clinic is open to anyone in the community. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments are recommended during the busy season. Scan the QR code and select Pharmacy to make your appointment.
